Establishment of 'Social Innovation Center'

In 1994, for the first time in Korea, Hanyang University founded 'Volunteer Corps' upon school's founding philosophy "Love in Deed and Truth". For last 22 years, students ('HeeMang Hanyang' Student Volunteers), faculties ('Happy Hanyang') and alumni ('Together Hanyang'), together with local community collaborated together to make this world a better place. Systematic cooperation with educational institutes, volunteer groups and start-ups has strongly upheld our mission since then. Hanyang University, as the first mover in South Korea to create 'Volunteer Corps' within campus, strongly stays in position that impacts South Korean society. Recently, a team that oversees overall activities of Volunteer Corps changed its name to 'Social Innovation Center', in order to provide further support on social innovation activities. Hanyang University's goal is to become a hub of social innovation in East Asia. It ultimately aims to become one of the leading universities in bringing huge impact onto this world.

As part of such endeavor, Hanyang pursues to attain "Ashoka U" accredit, which grants honorable benchmark to the schools that highly contribute to social innovation environment. By becoming the first one to be accredited as Ashoka U in East Asia, we expect to remain as a major driving force in Korean society.







Session 2 Love in Action Education, Volunteer, Start-up Education Change Maker Training Session

1 Social Volunteer Curriculum

Based on the practice of love, Hanyang is preparing a course program for the development of active social innovation-driven leadership capacity, which offers a new perspective on the recognition of social problems by adding social innovation to the special course of social services in Hanyang. During the 8-week semester, students will practice social problem-solving through the 'Social Innovation Capstone Design' program. In order to succeed in the regular semester, students will be required to complete the 'Change Maker Action Learning', And the completion of 36 credits of such majors is promoting the acquisition of the social innovation fusion major in multiple majors. Through revising existing social innovation curriculum system and reinforcing accessibility, HUGE enables each student to find career related to their field.

HUGE seeks to foster Changemakers who perform global social innovation by providing social innovation curriculum and majors through cooperation with social innovative companies.

1 Social Innovation Capstone Design

'Social Innovation Capstone Design' is a capstone design course in cooperation with social venture support company 'Root Impact'. Students can derive solutions for social problems with the help of professional education partners and can be led to starting a new social venture afterwards. Students think of solutions by themselves in the process of project research and implementation with professional partners, and furthermore practicing 'Love in Action' by establishing social ventures.

Starting from domestic companies' awareness and understanding on social issues, students participate in APYE (Asia Pacific Youth Exchange) program which allows them to share opinions with Asia Pacific students on global issues. Participants can improve their problem solving skills and utilizing prototyping, workshops and discussions, and can come up with a solution in the end.

After taking this course, it can be led to Change Maker Action Learning course or social innovation track.

Program Composition

This course is a 8-week program that consists of three steps - 'Intro', 'Learning', 'Project'. Participants learn methodology for problem analysis and problem solving, and strengthen the ability in the process of conducting practical projects and getting feedback from experts. During 2-week term between 'Intro' and 'Learning', participants can improve their global issue-solving capability through social innovation international training program, APYE(Asia Pacific Youth Exchange).

'Intro' (3 weeks)

- : Build social awareness and understanding through workshop and intensive program
- Raising the understanding of design thinking through home workshop
- Participating in 2-week APYE(Asia Pacific Youth Exchange) program

'Learning & Project' (5 weeks)

- : Defining the problem from given social phenomenon and deriving solutions
- New solution for improvement based on team discussion, prototyping and sympathy with consumers, set the proposal as ultimate outcome goal and input of instructor or mentor for support the process
- Weekly team project based on design and strategic thinking classes

Root Impact

- Sharing weekly progress, team communication and analyze current situation to specify program goal
- Using extra-curricular time for observing consumer interviews and assignment prototyping. Write weekly individual essay and give presentation based on peer, expert feedback



- *APYE entry fee: Support from ADB&UYA, Hanyang University, RootImpact + students sharing of cost
- * Course educational expenses : Support from RootImpact
- * Hanyang University supports sharing cost of students who are second-class citizen irrespectively their belonging

2 Changemaker Action Learning

Hanyang University and social innovation companies co-manage this program to foster Changemakers. This program is provided to students who completed Social Innovation Capstone Design course or students who want to acquire social innovation fusion major.

Student can complete the course by choosing between long term field practice connecting field practice system by term in Hanyang University or selective 4+1 graded school system.

*About long term field practice and selective 4+1 graded school system


- •Action Learning 1: Based on the project proceeded during the completing the Social Innovation Capstone Design course, students can realize and spread the project by taking field practice at relevant organization
- •Action Learning 2 : After designing own social venture that can help solving social problems through courses including social business entrepreneurship, understanding of social innovation, students can enlarge and actualize their business by taking field practice at existing innovation enterprises.
- Action Learning 3: Students can improve their capability of defining global issues and deriving solution through medium-term global volunteering and internship in international organizations including ADB

3 Track and Fusion major

Introduction to track, fusion major and composition

Degree of social innovation fusion major will be given if students who expertly want to learn and practice spirit of sharing, the founding philosophy of Hanyang University, complete 3 social innovation micro majors.

Social innovation fusion major composition



- Micro field 1: 'Micro field 1' will be given to students who completed 12 credits in social innovation courses vitally including social business entrepreneurship, social innovation capstone design, understanding of social innovation.
- Micro field 2: If students complete Changemaker Action Learning additionally, 'Micro field 2' will be given.
- Micro field 3: Students can register various courses selectively that practice 'Love in Action' completing Social Innovation Track or Impact Business Track that are similar to Micro field 1, 2

2 Student Changemaker SDGs Training Workshop

One of the crucial topics regarding UN SDGs(officially known as Transforming our world: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development) is Glocalization. In order to encourage Korean youths to engage in change-making activities and have global mindset on SDGs, Hanyang University hosted 'SDGs Change Maker Workshop' on September 10th and October 14th in 2016. More than one hundred college students from Sook Myung, Ehwa, Korea, and Hanyang university gathered up in Hanyang campus to take part in.

Unlike ordinary forums and round meetings that does not necessarily lead to practical solution, students who participated in the workshop came up with solutions to tackle each 17 SDG goal. Through this process, participants strengthened their mindset as global citizens, and also applied design thinking method to systematically tackle current problems.






The workshop was made up of five different sessions. 1) Team building, 2) Opening lecture, 3) SDGs change maker workshop, 4) SDGs change maker action learning, 5) Wrap-up. Drawing upon empathy and understanding of each other, participants collaborated to challenge status quo. Students first realized current status and the major problems global society faces. Then team of participants came up with innovative idea to tackle the issues. Lastly, each team conducted field prototype test.

Through this process, students not only gained meaningful experience, but also attained capability to bring change into this society. Five teams that performed excellent were invited and given chance to share their cases at ADB session on November 2016, 'Seventeen Hearts Festival in Hanyang'. Moreover, ADB granted students honor of certificate to encourage participants' sustainable engagement in SDGs activities after.

APYE(ASIA PACIFIC YOUTH EXCHANGE) program, co-hosted by ADB(Asia Development Bank) and UYA(Urban Youth Academy), aims to breed youth change makers. It also intends to give birth to youth-led projects that can bring positive impact onto this world. APYE provides youth participants from Asia-Pacific chance to cultivate their own capabilities in ODA and social entrepreneurship. Students who participated in APYE program can learn about global social problems using analytical research tools. Moreover, at the end of the program, they are given chance to experience on-the-spot feedbacks by implementing their ideas in the real world.

APYE program was first held in Kampong Thom, Cambodia in 2015. In 2016 it was held in Santa Rosa, Laguna, Philippines. In Santa Rosa, Laguna, about one hundred youths from Asia-Pacific region participated in 'Regional Development Project' to improve environments of Santa Rosa, Laguna.

Hanyang University Social Innovation Center granted scholarship to students who wished to join in APYE program. Ten students were selected and dispatched to Philippines in August 2016, and 14 students were dispatched to Philippines and Thailand in January 2017. By providing such opportunities, Hanyang actively encouraged students to participate in problem solving process and thus breed global leadership.

What I got from APYE is too many words to describe and it was a really great experience. I had a better understanding of the SDGs and it was time to think about my role in the SDGs and I was able to feel that there was a clear growth in my inner world after leaving and entering. I would like to work with the community service team to share my experiences with more people.

Lim Eun-Ji

Since I participated in the APYE program, my perspective, which was confined to our country, has widened. I have gone abroad a lot. Although the previous departure was all for travel purposes, departure to this Philippines is the first Journey not for travel purposes. I witnessed the situation of the Philippines, which would not have been possible for the purpose of travel, and I experienced my whole body. I was able to know and understand the reality of the global situation a little bit more, to learn how serious this situation is and what capacity it needs to get through this situation.

I knew what 'sustainable development' I heard in the media was more in detail, and I was able to feel its importance. I have a desire to do things that can help people in difficult countries through this program, which is not only one-off, but also a future-oriented program. I also have a small dream that I want to work in an international organization, although the course is not exactly settled yet.

There was a lot of realization that I just visited the Philippines and discussed SDGs with other people, not from a desk-based approach, but through their own experiences and their stories. In the future, I think I can motivate you.

First of all, I think the positive energy obtained from people was the greatest advantage. I could not forget how motivated I was by listening to the wonderful presentations of people with the idea of starting from the trivial, in this field that seemed to be doing nothing when I was not interested.

Park Chan-Yeong I was able to feel the specific energy as I had felt in previous overseas volunteer activities. I want to express this energy as enthusiasm, but as eagerness. It was felt that the desire for change and the desire for opportunity were completely different from me. I did not do it hard, but I tried to apply it to life and reality, to develop myself more and to take part in the program. Korea is a bit different from the Philippines in solving fundamental problems, but I thought that we should be enthusiastically approaching our problems.

In a span of 3 days and 2 nights, there have been changes within us. We felt that modernism isn't always the answer to the problems of the people, but should aid the lives of these people living on off-grid areas. The problems we saw on the internet, on TV and by word of mouth are realities that our fellow human beings are experiencing. With that, we want our voices to be heard to give voice to the voiceless. We want to do something impactful for the community. We help not for the sake of saying that we helped, but we want to understand others and make a difference in their lives.

I thought the SDGs were pretty unrealistic, especially in the field of energy, which was the subject of the team, and I thought it was pointless to proceed with the project by demanding technological advances and massive capital. However, by targeting a town called Mekongpong, assigning several alternatives, and reducing the impossible, I was able to think of a remnant of coffee waste. While it is not possible to solve all the energy problems of the world in a single day, I thought that it would be possible to increase the self-sufficiency of energy little by little, and I felt that the conditions of each country were different and the business model had to be changed accordingly.

Asia Pacific Youth Exchange



SVYE(Social Venture Youth Exchange), co-hosted by Hanyang University, LINC foundation(Hanyang University, Korea), ASB-MIT(Malaysia), ADB(Asia Development Bank), UYA(Urban Youth Academy), and MaGIC(Malaysia Global Innovation and Creativity Center), also aims to provide youths with opportunity to dedicate to global-scale problem solving process. In particular, students who participated in SVYE get chances to start up their own social enterprises.

SVYE was first held in 3rd-10th of February in 2017, in Korea. Each participant from Korea and Malaysia made up teams and came up with five social business models. Those business models were especially aimed at solving urban restoration problems in Malaysia. Each team focused on city slumism, urban restoration, educational problems and environmental problems cause by urban restoration process in Malaysia.

Also, the program included debate sessions and policy talks. Youths from Korea and Malaysia sat around the table to share their views on societal issues. After the session, representatives of each conference delivered small remarks and gave lectures on SDGs.







1 Volunteering & Social Innovation Program

Volunteer work is the closest activity among many activities done in Hanyang University to the founding philosophy 'Love in Action'.

Hanyang University classifies all volunteer works by SDGs to let members know to which item among 17 SDGs they can contribute by their activity so that members keep volunteer work spontaneously and to achieve social contribution and accomplish SDGs at once.

1 Ten Spoon One Bowl

Ten Spoon One Bowl' is a program through which students volunteer to work 1-2 hours per week at the university cafeterias, using their time in-between classes. Instead of getting paid for their work, students receive meal tickets and donate them for students who cannot afford them. The key idea of this program is that we can collect one spoon from 10 students, then 10 spoons of rice collected can make one bowl of rice for another student in need. This sharing and caring program was initiated by a student who took the social entrepreneurship class in September 2014. Since then, the program has been expanded to other universities, and now more than 1,000 students from 27 universities across the nation are participating. Approximately 12,700 tickets have been delivered to approximately 600 vulnerable fellow students.



2 HeeMang Hanyang Leader Group Activities







1_ UN NGO conference

It was the first time in Asia and Africa to participate in the UN NGO Conference. 2,500 NGO leaders from all around the world gathered in Gyeongju, Gyeongsangbuk-do, Republic of Korea, to strengthen the leader group's solidarity and cooperation with leading NGOs around the world.

2_ Student Planning Volunteering Program

Through volunteer activities in conjunction with various volunteer organizations in Seongdong-gu (Disabled Welfare Center, Kindergarten, and Volunteer Center), Hanyang provides a channel for students to get opportunities and information about service, as well as to do the direct volunteering works.

One day Mentoring - Mentoring for career guidance for elementary and junior high school students. Realistic personalized mentoring of career after matching with related department students by pre-studying children's dreams.

Campus Tour[Seongdong-gu Disability Welfare Center] - It is the reality of the peer disabled people that it is almost impossible for them to go to university. Based on the fact that people with disabilities who are interested in the university, leader group conducted a daily campus tour.

Majok-dong Mural Painting Service(Seongdong Volunteer Center) - Mural painting service that revitalizes the dark alleys of the community

3_ Feel the SDGs

It is a project designed to inform the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs : agreed by UN 193 countries) to whole members of Hanyang University. This event was held to promote easy practice of the SDGs in everyday life.

3 HappyBean volunteer work 2016.11.25 ~ 2016.11.26

Visiting senior citizens who live alone in the country, professors, staffs, students helped preparing wintering

Location : Hyanglee village, Budong-myeon, Cheongsong-gun, Gyeongbuk, Korea

Activities: Attaching paper weather strip, covering windows with vinyl, preventing outside water pipe from freeze, talking with elderly, other activities for reorganizing the village



4 Attaching sliding-proof tapes to prevent elderly from falling accident 2016.12.02 ~ 2016.12.17

80% of the accidents that occur frequently to the elderly are from sliding. As there are many elderly and slopes near the university, students carried forward a volunteer work attaching sliding-proof tapes on roads and aisles that have highly risk for sliding.



5 Global volunteer work in Nepal 2017.02.13 ~ 2017.02.20

To support the social venture 'Eco-Farmket' which is founded by student of Hanyang University and Bisam Gyawali from Nepal constructing toilets 'ECOSAN' and give consulting, students, researchers and professors went to Nepal for volunteer work.









6 Global volunteer work in Philippines

Larga, another social venture in the Philippines, has received support and consulting from Hanyang University LINC Foundation. 5 students (Department of Tourism) from Hanyang University and one employee went to the local activities for the interim feedback and the future plan that linked Santa Rosa with the major. It was the good experience the freshness and uniqueness of the tourist route built under the theme of Eco-tourism. Also during this time, they've seen enough attraction of the tourism resource itself. We expect to see the achievement of sustainable tourism development purpose along with local economic revitalization when the platform successfully launches officially.





1 Volunteer

Shim Young-woo (Department of Philosophy)

Q Why did you participate in multicultural mentoring program?

<u>A</u> Before military service, I couldn't choose between becoming a school teacher or a private academy lecturer. I felt most happy when I was teaching students and see them grow. However, indirect experience from private academy changed my mind. Lecturers there didn't match my ideal and I felt hard to narrow the gap between perceived reality and ideal. However, at that moment, I was about to find myself a new goal. After I finished military service, I was actively pursuing that new dream. However, the eager inside me, a passionate dream of becoming a teacher, did not vanish but started to grow. So, I searched for programs that I could join and get a chance to teach students. Then, I found 'Multicultural Mentoring Program'. One year ago, without hesitation, I applied for it and have been actively participating ever since.

Q What did you do during the mentoring period?

A _____ I regularly visited mentees' school and helped them study. Although my mentee's nationality was Korean, he had hard times getting used to Korean culture. So, I talked about daily life subjects with him and sometimes went out of the school to enjoy cultural activities such as watching musical and movie.

Q Any difficulties during mentoring period?

At first it was really hard. My mentee had already experienced similar mentor-mentee program and was quite used to the way his former mentor had done. Since he didn't seem to be satisfied with my style at first, I was not confident and sometimes even discouraged. Moreover, contrast to what I've expected of him, my mentee was highly interested in personal matters rather than in studying. So I acted even more strictly to make him concentrate on studying. But the result was even worse. Because of my strict attitude, he showed his negative emotion against me.

So I went to the mentoring supervisor to ask for advice. The supervisor told me that mentoring is not only about studying but also about empathizing with mentees. Also, the supervisor told me that it is important to listen to mentee's story and find him his life time goal.

Q Despite such difficulties, what was the most fruitful outcome?

As I followed instructions of the supervisor, harsh relation between mentee and I began to loosen up. He even gave me his phone number to keep in contact. As he opened up his mind, we shared many stories that he could not share with his friends or family. I helped him on the personal problems such as friend relation problem. After listening to his concern, I went to meet his school teacher to discuss about the problem. By telling his teacher about difficulties the mentee was facing, I could truly help him out.

Q Any comments?

Even though I was entitled as mentor, it was me who learned most from this program. To put it even more strong, it was mentee that taught me. I had a chance to look back on my attitudes, deeds and life. I would definitely love to participate in additional mentoring programs in near future.





2 Mentoring Support For Youth_ Volunteer

Oh Dong-geon (Department of Interior Architecture Design)

Why did you participate in multicultural mentoring program?

A lower was used to study music in high school. But I changed my mind to study humanities in the college. Thanks to support from my parents, I could fully concentrate on Korean SAT to get into humanity department. After few years, I finally got into Hanyang University. Since then I felt kind of responsibility to pay this back to society. I decided to help others who are underprivileged. At first I simply donated money that I earned from private tutoring. Then I found community learning center that provides free mentoring and meal service to the underprivileged, single-parents and multicultural family children. I realized I did not only have to reach out to the world outside, but rather I could help those who suffer in my community. This is why I joined in multicultural mentoring program.

Q How did you feel about mentoring institution?

A lidd my activity at a community child center in Namyang-Ju. Head of the center was both church minister and social worker. Although the center was financed by church foundation, the church itself was in financially unstable situation. Still, the center had to provide free service to 20~30 children every day. Although auxiliary policemen helped out by teaching English and Math each week, it was only occasional support. The center needed regular and stable support from outside.

Q What did you do during the mentoring period?

A ______ I mainly mentored middle and high school students. Those students were mostly suffering from financial difficulties. In addition to mentoring, I went to watch movie and musical with them. One day, I invited my mentee to a drama I made. Since they were going over financial hardships, most of them had been naturally alienated from cultural life. But by giving them such opportunities, I could see them grow and feel happy.

Q What was the most fruitful outcome?

Every mentee had their own story. So I had to be careful and sensitive when meeting them. It was my responsibility and patience to wait until mentees open up their mind. Since my mentees were not interested in studying, it was a worthwhile moment when they told me about their dream. Because once the target was set, it was natural for them to work hard to achieve their goals. I also felt worthy when middle school mentees first said hello to me. They were normally shy and passive, so it was a great breakthrough.

Q Anything to say?

A I am a beneficiary of the program. This program granted me a scholarship. Since I could spend part of this scholarship in building intimate relation with mentees, it was kind of win-win game to for both. Also, I achieved the goal I had set before starting the mentoring; a goal to become a brother-like mentor. It was the biggest accomplishment in my life. Thank you all.

Social Venture is an enterprise or organization based on creativity founded by a social enterpriser to solve social problems. Social venture offers social service or jobs to vulnerable social group through sales that is similar to the one of ordinary enterprise.

Social Innovation Center of Hanyang University tries to be a platform that supports social innovative activities that include volunteer work and try to solve social problem fundamentally and sustainably. Social Innovation Center offers students chances to recognize social problems and build entrepreneurship by supporting social ventures, one way to solve social problems.

Social ventures will develop various relations of cooperation with Hanyang University, community, world at major-related work experience, joint research of social problems, developing global social innovation program.

1 Project "DETRIS" by STATION208: Interactive small-donation Platform

"DETRIS", a project launched by a social venture called STATION208, raises fund by using a special small donation machine. With the money donated, the social venture delivers money to the ones who are in need. "DETRIS machine" was invented by Hanyang University students with full financial support from Social Innovation Center and LINC Foundation. Equivalent 20,000 USD was granted to 'STATION 208'. The name DETRIS was derived from a casual game called "Tetris". It has similar operating structure with Tetris. When donors touch screen of the DETRIS machine with their credit card, blocks fall down or fill in the screen to show fundraising topic. Choi Gyu-sun (Economics and Finance), Kim Eun-seo (Industrial Engineering), Yang Jae-hyeong (Economics and Finance), Lim Kyeong-hoon (Image Design, Kookmin University) gathered up in 'Social Entrepreneurship' Class in 2016. As a part of their team project they came up with this idea and implemented it immediately. They contemplated how they could make donation more fun and easy, which gave birth to 'Funation (Fun+donation' approach). DETRIS machine was first installed inside Hanynag University subway station. It attracted a floating population and offered them small amount donation (0.5cent per touch). By using such strategy, STATION 208 team could successfully tap into civil society's potential.

Three fundraising projects was conducted since 2016. First

one was held from September 20th and October 20th, 2016. For a month, each week set different fundraising goals. First week's goal was to raise fund to provide English education to the underprivileged children. Second goal was to donate free school uniforms to low-income middle school students. Medical expense for premature baby and construction budget

for sanitary toilet was raised for third and fourth week, respective. During the period, more than 3,000 students and school officials in Hanyang University donated total 1,000,000 won (equivalent to 1,000 USD). Second project was held as a part of "Seventeen Hearts Festival". In collaboration with Hanyang University's NPO "TENSPOONS", the project aimed at raising fund for festival for workers in Hanyang. Total 1,090 students donated 327,000 won (equivalent to 327 USD), providing free lunch and music concert to 174 workers in school. Third project raised funds to incubate a social venture in Nepal. The social venture named 'Eco-Farmket' constructs sanitary toilet in Nepal's local community. 710,000 won (equivalent to 710 USD) was raised to assist Eco-Farmket construct sanitary restrooms. Also, Social Innovation Center's changemaker team was dispatched to Nepal to deliver both the fund and workforce.

L.A.F.E. (Leaders and Financial Education) aims to meet financial education needs of college students. Statistics show that 25 percent of college students are taking on debt, many of whom suffering from financial hardships. This financial hardship makes students difficult to concentrate on study and sometime force them to lend money from third party. Student loan currently exceeds 1 trillion won, which is equivalent of 870 million US dollars.

In order to tackle the status quo, L.A.F.E raised social fund named "KIDARI BANK". They raised fund from school officials, students, and faculties in Hanyang University. However, they found that temporary financial support could not effectively tackle hardships of the underprivileged students. L.A.F.E thought the need to come up with more sustainable solution, which is education. They planned to provide systematic financial management training session to college students. Training session included life-time financial management.

What is "Eco-Farmket"?

Eco-Farmket is a social venture founded in 2017 that produces sanitary restroom called 'ECOSAN'. ECOSAN is also made of eco-friendly materials. By using eco-friendly materials to produce sanitary restrooms in local community, Kathmandu, Nepal, it aims to solve both the health and environmental problems in the region. Furthermore, Eco-FarmketĐutilizes excrement from restroom to use them as an organic fertilizer. By using such strategy, it can grow crops and vegetables from fertile land, relieving economic hardships and food shortage problem of the local. Hanyang University Social Innovation Center dispatched school officials and student volunteers to help them construct ECOSAN restroom in February 2017. Now Eco-Farmket and Hanyang University is collaborating to set up marketing strategy to sell local products. Also, they are developing appropriate technology that efficiently turns excrement into fertilizer.

Eco-Farmket plans to cooperate with volunteering corps and INGOs. On the other side, it intends to build strategic relation with college departments. By conducting research together with departments of architecture, agriculture, and health, it can further develop appropriate technology. Final destination of this promising social venture is to become an excellent model in industry-technology cooperation. Moreover, in collaboration with KOICA, INGOs, and local government, it plans spread social impact beyond Kathmandu.





4 Larga! Santa Rosa

Through this strategic approach, they could gain indirect onsite experience in marketing, product development, and accounting environment. As Larga! Santa Rosa plans to expand its business model to other regions, interdisciplinary approach between diverse majors are expected. Undergraduate major of founders are business, computer software engineering, information system, respective. Their application prototype drew attention from both the local community and international organization. Asian Development Bank (ADB) and Local governments showed strong interest in the application.






Arirang

Arirang project

Arirang, one of the most popular folk songs in Korea, has now been given a new meaning-"Discover happiness of finding yourself."

'2016 Hanyang Seventeen Hearts Festival' has structured 17 elements of UN SDGs with 17 hearts image. UN SDGs are seventeen sustainable development goals set by 193 UN member nations, agreed upon achieving them by 2030. 2016 Hanyang Seventeen Hearts Festival have proceeded with three projects including 'Arirang for Neighbors', 'Arirang for Youth', 'Arirang for Globe' between September to November.

The main purpose of the festival was to encourage students to take initiative in social innovation activities and to demonstrate global leadership that goes beyond the simple concept of social contribution.

1 Arirang for Neighbors

Project "Small Donation" raised by a social venture "STATION 208" 9/20~10/20

In collaboration with LINC foundation, social venture that deals with small donation business 'STATION 208' was founded as our initial project. By creating atmosphere of small donation among college campus, we raised students' awareness level on domestic and global social problems, and further provided guidance for students to come up with sustainable solutions on social problems.

Each subject for fundraising campaign varied week by week. First week was set up to support class expense for the underprivileged students, and second week to deliver free uniforms to the less fortunate middle school students. Third and fourth week supported medical expense for premature baby and renovation of toilets.

During the campaign period more than 3,000 students and faculty members in Hanyang participated, donating about 1,000,000 won. These money was donated to Korea Food for the Hungry International and finally delivered to people in need. Station 208's activity was released by many public outlets in Korea.



2 Arirang for Youth

Korea Donation for Education Expo_9/22~9/25

To provide the youth with opportunities to discover and nurture their talents, in collaboration with the Ministry of Education, Korea Foundation for the Advancement of Science and Creativity, and Busan metropolitan and Provincial Offices of Education, 'Korea Donation for Education Expo' was held between September 22nd and 25th. Hanyang University participated in the expo, articulating the message "Discover happiness of finding yourself." 76 people from Hanyang University, from students to faculties to professors, came up with many ideas that were closely related to UN SDGs. Related research included fields such as Engineering, Art & Technology, and Science. Hanyang students engaged as mentors for high school students who participated in the event. Also, a session that specifically dealt with SDGs provided experiential program to the youth. The program gained positive feedback from the youth for its applicability to real life.

Last day of the festival went on with project related to global scale social contribution. As a follow up event to 2nd Asia Pacific Youth Exchange held in Manilla, Philippines in 2016, it provided a platform in which college students can take their initiative to make this world a better place. At the end of the conference, with students from Nepal, Bangladesh, Philippines, Mongolia and officials from UN, Hanyang university conducted experiential program that focused on restoring streamlet. Co-held by Hanyang University Social Innovation Center, LINC foundation and ADB (Asian Development Bank), the conference was composed of five different sessions. Each five session was 1) Case presentation on student social innovation 2) Korean traditional musical 'Arirang show' 3) Asia Pacific Social Venture Idea Competition 4) Asian Development Bank Session 5) AIESEC-Korea Youth Speak Forum.

During that time, school workers were given opportunities to enjoy 17 hearts festival with students and faculties. This event brought all the school members together in one place, binding them around "Arirang"



Asia Pacific Social Venture Idea Competition

Eight non-Korean teams that won 2nd Asia Pacific Youth Exchange(Co supervised by ADB(Asian Development Bank) and Urban Youth Academy) and five Korean teams came up with ideas to tackle social problems of developing countries using business strategies. Agreement upon business model assistance

Among eight non-Korean teams that participated in APSVIC (Asia Pacific Social Venture Idea Competition), five teams have been matched with Hanyang University students as co-founders. 
